

# Sponsors not deterred after attack

An Eastgate recruitment agency is supporting the residents with special needs at the Living Link Home in Parkhurst.

The attack at the home of mentally impaired persons recently has not deterred its sponsors.

Residents of the Living Link Home in Parkhurst were held up at gunpoint and robbed of their personal belongings.

Stone Soup's media liaison officer, Nabila Mayet, said that the incident left the residents traumatised and deflated.

PAG Recruitment Agency in Eastgate is the main sponsor of the Living Link Home. The Eastgate branch manager, Linda Geelhuizen, said that the home's aim is to help the mentally impaired live independently through their Adult Integrated Programme and not let their impairment affect their growth.

The Eastgate branch sponsors the tuition fees for one of these adults, Zandisile Tshabalala, an 18-year-old student from Soweto.

Nabila said that the Living Link aims to assist Zandisile's integration into society by facilitating his transition from school to work to independent living.
